# PROHIBITION IN SEATTLE

The Whisky Combine, under this heading, is now attempting to "prove" to the people of British Columbia that Seattle is suffering under Prohibition laws.

As always the Whisky Combine hides the real issues in the present campaign. It has sought to find a single factor which would permit a defence of the liquor traffic, but without the faintest sign of success.

In its latest advertisement, costing hundreds of dollars and paid for from them gigantic "boodle" barrels the Combine attempts to prove that Seattle business has been impaired by the inauguration of Prohibition. Read what Editor C. B. Blethen of the Seattle Times has to say about Prohibition in the Sound City. The Seattle Times, please remember, was the greatest foe to the Prohibition movement in Washington and fought the act to the last minute.

#### HERE IS WHAT THE SEATTLE TIMES SAYS OF PROHIBITION IN THAT CITY

Now, eight months later, this is what Mr. Blethen has to say: "My paper fought its damndest against Prohibition. We fought it on economic grounds alone. We believed that in a great seaport city, with a population of upwards of 330,000, Prohibition would be destructive, that it would bring economic disaster. In spite of all we could do Prohibition carried and went into effect January 1st. "We in Washington already know that Prohibition is a great benefit morally and from an economic standpoint. Its moral benefit has been tremendous. Seattle had 336 saloons and we had about 1,600 arrests a month for crimes and misdemeanors growing out of liquor drinking. The decrease has been phenomenal; almost unbelievable.

"Then we have the great economic facts. Bank deposits have increased. Grocery stores and markets are doing a greater business. Collections are fully 50 per cent. better and in a recent investigation which I made, every drygoods store in Seattle stated that they had shown a wonderful increase in business. Each store reported the largest business done in years.

"There are no empty stores, which the liquor interests claimed would result if Prohibition carried. Rents have actually increased. People are buying better food and better clothes."

Whom can you believe, Mr. Elector, the vicious Whisky Combine or the editor of Washington's greatest newspaper, who fought Prohibition and now admits his mistake?
