## PROVINCE SWEEPED CLEAN BY THE LIBERALS

### VANCOUVER AND VICTORIA GO SOLID -- THE NORTH RETURNS THREE LIBERALS

#### THIRTY-SEVEN LIBERALS AND TEN CONSERVATIVES LIKELY

**VANCOUVER AND VICTORIA GO SOLID—PREMIER AMONG THE FALLEN—T. D. PATTULLO, ALEX. M. MANSON AND F. H. MOBLEY ELECTED FROM NORTH—ROSS ONLY MINISTER LEFT**

Up to midnight last night, the Liberals had carried 33 seats and the Conservatives 14 in the general election. Bowser and his ministers went down to defeat. Hon. W. R. Ross, so far, has a chance of election, as he is only 15 votes behind John McInnes. In Vancouver, six Liberals were returned, with M. A. Macdonald heading the poll. In Victoria, four Liberals were returned, with H. C. Brewster heading the poll. The following are the results up to midnight:

Cariboo: J. Yorston, Liberal; seven polls out of 21 gave 69 majority.

Columbia: Six polls out of sixteen gave John Buchan, Liberal, 157 of a majority.

Cowichan: Capt. W. H. Hayward, Conservative, elected by 84 of a majority.

Comox: Twenty-nine out of fifty-seven polls gives Hugh Stewart, Liberal, 506 of a majority.

Chilliwack: W. D. Maeken, Conservative, is leading by a small majority.

Cranbrook: Dr. King, Liberal, is leading.

Dewdney: John Oliver, Liberal, is elected.

Esquimalt: A. W. McCurdy, Liberal, is elected.

Fernie: A. J. Fisher, Liberal, is elected.

Grand Forks: J. E. Thompson, Liberal, is elected.

Greenwood: Dr. J. D. McLean, Liberal, is elected.

Islands: M. B. Jackson, Liberal, is elected.

Kamloops: F. W. Anderson, Liberal, is elected.

Kaslo: R. J. Long, Conservative, is leading by sixty of a majority.

Lillooet: J. B. Bryson, Liberal, is leading by 28 of a majority.

Nanaimo: Wm. Sloan, Liberal, is elected by 500 of a majority.

Nelson: Dr. W. O. Rose, Conservative, is elected by 48 of a majority.

Newcastle: Parker Williams, Socialist, is elected by 100 of a majority.

New Westminster: D. Whiteside, Liberal, is elected by 318 of a majority.

North Okanagan: Dr. K. McDonald, Liberal, is leading by a majority of 147.

North Vancouver: Mayor Hanes, Liberal, is elected.

Omineca: Alex. Manson, Liberal, leading with 131 of a majority.

Revelstoke: Dr. Sutherland, Liberal, is leading with 236 of a majority.

Rossland: W. D. Wilson, Liberal, elected by a small majority.

Similkameen: L. W. Shatford, Conservative, leading with 45 of a majority.

Slocan: Hunter, Conservative, and Chas. F. Nelson, Liberal, tie, with other places to hear from.

South Okanagan: Mayor Jones, Conservative, elected by 108 of a majority.

South Vancouver: J. W. Weart, Liberal, elected.

Trail: M. H. Sullivan, Liberal, leading by 19 of a majority.

Vancouver: Six Liberals elected.

Victoria: Four Liberals elected.

Jale: Joseph Walters, Liberal, leading by 182 of a majority.

#### GREEKS HAVE SURRENDERED FORT KAVALA

American Citizens are in Danger From Rioting—Allies Dissatisfied with the new Greek Premier.

(Special to The Daily News.)

Athens, Sept. 15.—The British Legation has informed American Minister Droppers that the Greek government has surrendered to Bulgaria the last of the Kavala forts.

Entente warships removed fifteen hundred Greek soldiers from Kavala to Thasos.

Rioting is reported from Kavala. Houses and shops have been pillaged and the lives and property of American citizens have been endangered. The Turks massacred several citizens when the Greek garrison withdrew.

The Entente powers are dissatisfied with the program of the new Greek premier, Dimitracopulos, whose acceptance of the premiership was based upon his being given complete authority and control. The national policy permits of the abandonment of the formation of a cabinet.

#### 102ND BATTALION VOTED AGAINST GOVERNMENT

A letter arrived in town this morning from Charles Youngman, of the 102nd Battalion. Charlie says the boys are delighted to receive copies of The Daily News. He concludes by stating that the vote in the 102nd went solidly against the government and that T. D. Pattullo may expect a very large majority from that battalion.

#### PROHIBITION AND WOMAN'S SUFFRAGE

Throughout the province the vote was very heavily in favor of Prohibition and Woman's Suffrage. In Prince Rupert, 554 voted for Prohibition and 241 against while the vote in favor of giving the franchise to women was 617 and 172 against. In a few of the smaller places the vote was against prohibition, but the total majority for it is large. The final figures are not yet to hand.

#### FATAL EXPLOSION

Newark, Sept. 15.—Five employees of the Interstate Cream Company, including Samuel Botkin, the president, have been killed by the explosion of an ammonia tank.

#### DRYDOCK

Hon. Robert Rogers has wired to Mayor McCaffery to the effect that the drydock is not yet completed and that the company has never said that it is willing to lease the plant to the Cotton interests. From lack of space it is impossible for us to reproduce the telegram in full.

#### FRENCH PIERCE GERMAN LINES EFFECTIVELY

German Defences Divided—Allies Have Taken Fifty-four Thousand Prisoners in big Offensive.

Paris, Sept. 15.—The French have pierced clear through the German front at Bouchavesnes, effecting a separation of the enemy's defensive organization.

Since the beginning of the offensive on the western front, the French and British on the Somme front and in front of Verdun have captured fifty-four thousand prisoners and have taken seven hundred and twenty guns.

#### Italian Success.

Rome, Sept. 15.—Italian airships dropped five tons of explosives on the Austrian arsenal and aeroplane hangars near Trieste, inflicting severe damage on surrounding property.

#### Harrison Liner sunk.

London, Sept. 15.—The Harrison liner Counsellor, bound from Vancouver for Liverpool, has been sunk. Her crew was saved.

#### AUSTRIANS BELIEVED RUMANIA UNREADY

London, Sept. 15.—Premier Tisza, on the resumption of the debate in the House of Representatives of the Austrian and Hungarian parliaments, admitted that he had never realized that Rumania was properly ready for war, up to the time she joined the Allies. He believed that the entrance of Rumania into Bulgaria, coupled with the Bulgarian counter-attacks, will result in loss to the Rumanian alliance.

#### PACIFIC COAST STEAMER BURNED

Marshfield, Ore., Sept. 15.—Fire has completely destroyed the Pacific Coast Steamship Company's steamer Congress. Her two hundred and fifty-three passengers and a hundred and seventy of a crew were saved.
