Later.

Returns this morning show Kitsumkalum Lake giving 12 votes to Pattullo and 3 to Manson, bringing T. D. Pattullo's majority up to 164. Local Conservatives concede Mr. Pattullo's election.

The latest returns from Vancouver indicate that there will be 37 Liberals in the house and ten Conservatives. The Conservatives will be from Cowichan, Nelson, Trail, Lillooet, South Okanagan, Similkameen, Slokan, Alberni and Fort George. W. B.

Ross is the only member of the Bowser cabinet to be elected and the soldiers' vote may reverse the verdict, as Mr. Ross' majority is small.

The result of the voting in England is expected soon, as the votes are being counted now. The European ballots will not be counted until October 12th.
