## IS PROTESTING HIS SINCERITY

King Personally Assures British Minister that Greece Did Not Intend to Join Germans.

London, Oct. 19 .- King Constantine, who returned hurriedly to Athens yesterday, has personally assured the British Ambassador at the Greek capital that there was no foundation for the suspicion that Greece contemplated attacking the Allied forces commanded by Genaral Sarrail at Saloniki. He declared his readiness to immediately withdraw the Greek forces-stationed in the vicinity of Larissa as proof of his sincerity
