bad and they had to sink an air
 shaft. Shortly after that they
 struck the pay and it looks as if
 they are bound to take out as
 much gold as was taken out of
 the other parts of the creek forty
 years ago.

They have taken out \$1,800 in
 twenty-two days, and Bill is go-
 ing south quite confident that he
 will return to find that his part-
 ner has piled up a little fortune
 in his absence. Mr. Steele says
 that there is a big mining future
 before the Manson Creek country
 just as soon as the Thomas rail-
 road is built, as there are large
 bodies of low grade ores which

 will be inserted without any action on
 their part. I therefore call special at-
 tention to the necessity of agreement
 holders making declarations.
