MERELY WIND

Windermere, the special London correspondent of the Canadian Tory press, has broken out again. This gentleman has not been much in evidence since the outbreak of war, but he evidently thinks that the situation in Ottawa is worthy of some comment. According to Windermere, or "Merely Wind," as The Sun calls him on occasion, business circles in London are intensely interested in the forthcoming developments in Ottawa, and that the matter is also being widely discussed in financial and military circles. He does not say if it is in "honorary" military circles, but it must be so, as the active officers are not supposed to discuss politics, or have any for that matter.

Windermere, unfortunately, gives the show away when he says, in boosting Sir Thomas White as the coming premier, that the Finance Minister's strength, "outside of his financial ability, is that he has never been ultra-Conservative in polities. He is one man who can merge interests here which must be merged if Canada is not to lose out." This is purely political clap-trap of the usual Tory order London financial interests are not a bit interested as to whether Canada has a Tory, Liberal or Coalition government and there is probably not a London business man, who is attending strictly to business, who could tell you whether Sir Thomas is ultra-Conservative or ultraanything else. A good many prominent London business men could not tell off-hand whether Canada has at the present moment a Liberal or a Conservative government. They know that Sir Robert Bor-




