CITY OF PRINCE RUPERT ATTENTION VOTERS

a declaration giving particulars of their
title, before the last day of November.
Any person neglecting to take such de-
claration will not be entered on the voters'
list.

It is impossible for me to ascertain the
names of agreement holders unless they
come in personally.

It will greatly facilitate matters if per-
sons wishing to make declaration bring
their agreements, so that I may inspect
them and thus prevent errors.

Reference to old voters' lists satisfies
me that only a small proportion of agree-
ment holders have registered in past
years. This, I believe, has happened be-
cause people wrongly think their names
will be inserted without any action on
their part. I therefore call special at-
tention to the necessity of agreement
holders making declarations.
