The Fredericton Daily Gleaner, in a two-column article on the New Brunswick Kilties (Sir Sam's Own), states that "the Minister of Militia having authorized the recruiting of 'all the MacLeans and their connections throughout Canada' for this unit, plans have been completed for a Dominionwide campaign." Five officers are now touring the Dominion in an effort to round up the MacLeans.
