The general committee of the city council last night brought in a report recommending the appointment of James Neville to the Fire Department in place of Jas. Currie, who has resigned. The report was adopted.

Mrs. A. A. Brand has gone to England to meet her son, Private Brand of the 102nd Battalion, who has earned a brief furlough. Miss Brand accompanied her mother on the first stage of the journey, leaving her at Vancouver.

The city council last night, on the motion of Ald. Nelson, seconded by Ald. McRae, decided to make reductions in the telephone charges to those whose phones were out of order because of the snowstorm.

At the Fortnightly Club, in the Presbyterian Church on Wednesday evening, the debate is, "Resolved that Canada should have conscription at once." The affirmative will be taken by Mr. Patmore and Mr. Carpenter and the negative by Mr. Naden and Mr. Hunter.

Ald. Casey at the council meeting last night drew the attention of the light committee to the fact that certain houses across the creek could not get light connection because of the lack of certain supplies which have not been purchased. It was referred to the committee.

## COUNCIL TO DISCUSS HIGH COST OF LIVING

(Continued From Page One.)

Rae, "and, if they are absurd, it is also well that we know."

Ald. Montgomery said that he favored the fullest investigation. Sugar, shoes and most other commodities were very high, and going higher and it was time we knew why this was. It seemed to him that it was necessary to capture three lines of trenches before anything could be done and the sooner they started the better.

Ald. Nelson read from the order-in-council to show that Ald. Casey's motion was not in accordance with the order. He favored an enquiry but it would be useless to pass a resolution, in face of the wording of the order.

Ald. Casey said that he obtained his figures in regard to sugar from a merchant who would provide the documents to prove his statements. He did not wish to move a resolution contrary to the order-in-council, his idea being to have an enquiry along the lines laid down in that order. He was willing to withdraw his resolution if it was out of order.

Ald. Montgomery said that if there was doubt as to the resolution, he thought that the council as a whole should go into the matter and take action along the proper lines. The main thing was to get started in the matter.

Ald. Casey then withdrew his motion and moved that the council go into the high cost of living according to the wording of the order-in-council.

The city solicitor said that it was clear that the council had no power to pay money to anyone to sit on any enquiry. They must first make up their minds that certain specific articles were being held up to a high price and that then they would proceed to

make an examination of prices.

Mayor McCaffery suggested that they meet in committee of the whole on Friday at 3 p. m. to discuss the matter fully.

Ald. McRae suggested that they pass a resolution now regarding any article that was supposed to be too high, so that they would have something to go upon in committee. It was finally decided to hold a full discussion at Friday's meeting and pass any necessary resolution next Monday.
