THREE GOOD RECIPES**Devil Cake**

1 cupful of sugar, half a cupful of butter, 1 cupful of milk, 2 eggs well beaten, 1 level teaspoonful of soda. When this is mixed have ready 1 cupful of grated chocolate boiled with one cup of milk and stir in while hot. White icing slightly acid is nice between the layers.

Spanish Steak

One pound of steak, one large Spanish onion, four tomatoes, three ounces of macaroni, one ounce of flour, one ounce of butter, one pint of stock or water, salt and pepper to taste. Put the butter in a saucepan and let it cook one hour. Dish up with meat in the centre, macaroni and tomato around. Pour the gravy over.

Nut Bread

For nut bread, take 4 cups flour, 1 cup sugar, 2 cups milk, 3 teaspoonfuls baking powder, 1-2 teaspoonful salt, 1 egg, 1 cup chopped walnuts. Mix dry ingredients, add milk, eggs, and nuts. Allow to stand 20 minutes, then bake in greased tin in moderate oven.

Charles C. Spink of St. Louis, will sail for England on Wednesday to organize a baseball league for the Britons. It is said there are enough Americans in England to support a small league. A few teams already have been formed, but there is no organization. Spink will look over the situation and if the prospects are at all encouraging he hopes to establish a six-club league and get a number of his players from America.

Jack Johnson, negro champion, has returned from his two months' trip, and the first thing he did was to enter into a tentative agreement to box "Confessor" Jack O'Brien before the latter's club in Quakerburg. No date has been set, but it will be during the first week in June. O'Brien guarantees Johnson a lump sum of \$10,000.
