Charged with Being the Leader of the Camorra

CAPTURED IN RAID

Was Arrested at the Headquarters of the Organisation on Mount Vesuvius—Is Accused by Some of the Band.

(Canadian Press Dispatch)
 Naples, May 11.—Still another priest has been arrested in connection with the criminal activities of the Camorra. He is Angelo Francese, who, with seventeen others, was captured in a raid on the Camorrista's burglary headquarters at Poggio Marino, on the slope of Mt. Vesuvius. Francese denies knowledge of the criminal activities of the band, but several of the prisoners are said to have confessed and accused him of being the leader.

Ask for Fifteen Million Pounds to Start on

HOME RULE PROBLEM

They Want England to Give the Irish Exchequer a Big Sum of Money to Start National Housekeeping with.

London, May 11.—The Times says that differences of opinion exist in the cabinet concerning the Home Rule Bill, which has been some time in preparation. It is intended to establish a separate Irish exchequer. The Nationalists demand that England at the outset pay thereinto fifteen millions of pounds sterling as a nest egg, apart from the annual subsidy. This question is found difficult. There is also a difference of view as to the number of representatives to be retained at Westminster and as to the conditions of their retention.

The launch remained here today, but may proceed on her journey without him.

NEIGHBORS WERE NOISY

Ladies Had Wild Time at Denver Convention

POLICE CALLED IN

"Royal Neighbors of America," a Ladies Organisation Had a Royal Neighborly Time in Electing a Supreme Oracle.

Denver, Col., May 10.—Disorderly scenes characterized the sessions of the Royal Neighbors of America yesterday, and the climax came when a police automobile filled with bluecoats appeared on the scene of the meeting in answer to a riot call. The police sergeant in charge, after reviewing the turmoil in the convention hall, decided that it was nothing that required his attention and retired without taking action. The Royal Neighbors of America is a society of women. For three hours and fifty minutes the faction supporting Mrs. E. A. Enright for Supreme Oracle, kept up an increasing noise, while two of their number stationed themselves at the end of the rostrum and urged the rest to "keep it up." Quiet was not restored until an overnight truce was declared.

AUTO WRECK AT VICTORIA

Herbert Thomson Reported Dying of His Injuries

STRUCK TELEPHONE POLE

Car was Travelling at Rate of Fifty Miles an Hour on Rockland Avenue This Morning. Three Occupants Injured.

 Victoria, May 11.—An automobile owned by Herbert Thomson containing Mr. Thomson and two friends Bryan Coombe and Napier Gowen, were racing down Rockland avenue at fifty miles an hour this morning when the car struck a telephone pole, demolishing the car and hurling the occupants out. Mr. Thomson is now in the hospital dying of his injuries. Coombe and Gowen though badly hurt will recover.
