MUNICIPAL ELECTION

There is little excitement over the municipal elections this year and there are not nearly so many aldermanic candidates in the field as at this time last year, when there was something of an epidemic in that line. That there are so few new aspirants for office is a sign that the present members of the aldermanic board have acquitted themselves well.

In a year when retrenchment was of necessity the watchword, Mayor McCaffery and his aldermen did their duty, disagreeable though it sometimes must have been, without fear or favor. Mayor McCaffery made few pre-election promises, but, on taking office, he intimated that he felt that he had been placed in the civic chair to carry out schemes of retrenchment and to carry through the negotiations for the sale of the city's bonds. Mr. McCaffery has brought to the affairs of the city the business acumen he has shown in conducting his private business, and every taxpayer today must realize in his pocket that the city has benefitted tremendously from Mr. McCaffery's term in office.

On Thursday, he will return THE NEW DEPUTY to the chair with renewed confidence, satisfied that he has the loyal support of the citizens of Prince Rupert in his efforts to gradually build up a strong business community here. The fact that the Emerson interests are shortly to start building a sawmill and shingle mill at Seal Cove is largely due to the efforts of Mayor McCaffery and the mayor has been busy for weeks and months past in trying to bring other industries to this vicinity, one or more of which will very

probably take definite shape at no distant date.

That Mayor McCaffery will be supported in the council by DECLINE SUBSTITUTES eight aldermen who will carry on the affairs of the city with care and economy during the year will be the desire of every citizen, and the matter is entirely in the hands of the citizens. The passing of the reserve fund bylaw will do much towards placing the finances of the city upon a firm and sure basis, and it will be up to the new council to conduct civic affairs as the past council has done, and as they have conducted their affairs as business men in the past year.

There is a strong possibility that the war will be over about mid-summer, then there may be room for more ambitious schemes, but, so long as the ness men is necessary in times like the present, and, if the clouds of war do lift, the same type of council will still be the proper one to administer the affairs of the city of Prince Rupert.

As was to be expected, the appointment of George R. Naden, as Deputy Minister of Lands, is hailed with the liveliest satisfaction, and Hon. T D. Pattullo is to be congratulated on his coming north to find his deputy. Than Mr. Naden, a happier choice could not have been made. 
