## MORE SHELLS

Minister German Foreign Zimmerman ably seconds the Kaiser in his protestations that Berlin will never consider a humiliating peace, and that the people of Germany would rather die than submit to defeat. Looking back, one will remember that when Germany, or at least the Prussian element in Germany, was preparing hardest for war. Berlin spoke most loudly of preserving the peace of Europe. It is not impossible, nor unlikely, that today, when Germany is shouting loudest about continuing the war, she is most ready for peace. Minister Zimmerman says that to pursue the quest for peace further would be to display weakness, but the vehement protests of the Prussian determination not to go down to defeat is probably taken, in many quarters, as a much more significant sign of weakness than the further discussion of peace. Had Germany done no boasting in the past, the wellnigh hysterical utterances of the Prussian leaders might have a different value placed upon them, but so much that is bombastic and ridiculous has already come from the same quarter that the general opinion, not only in the Allied countries, but in neutral capitals, is apt to be that Berlin has shot its bolt
