GREEK DUPLICITY

It would appear that the Entente Allies have again been caught napping in Greece. While the French and British forces have been carefully preserving law and order between the opposing factions, King Constantine has evidently been devoting his energies to scheming for the linking up of his troops, with the Turks and Bulgarians in the north, and, now that his plans have matured, he will probably bid the Entente a polite good-bye.

The man in the street says, "I told you so" and "the beggars ought to have been shelled out of Athens long ago," but, unfortunately, nations such as the French, Italian and British cannot conduct their negotiations with other powers by the catch-as-catch-can rules, but must follow along the usual lines of diplomacy. In this war, the Allies have come off second best in all diplomatic matters simply because they have played the game according to the recognized rules and, if they have been fooled, they have at least done the honorable thing.


