TORY FEARS

The Toronto Daily News is worrying considerably these days about the "disorganization which threatens the Liberal party in Canada." It is very kind of this Tory organ to be so anxious about the health of the Liberal party, which is very good indeed, thank you, in fact, never was more robust. The Tory organ seeks to show that the authority and leadership of Sir Wilfrid Laurier is questioned and even repudiated everywhere except in Quebec and British Columbia, at least the latter province is omitted when the others are mentioned as being in a state of seething revolt.

The fact of the matter is that the Tories cannot be reconciled to the fact that the Liberals have a leader, and such a leader, while they have a makeshift in Sir Robert Borden. To offset the alleged lack of unity in the Liberal ranks, the Toronto News expatiates at considerable length, in fact, far too great a length to be convincing, on the solidarity of the Conservative party. It is careful not to cite any instances of this solidarity but it might have cited many. For instance, it might have dealt at length with the Sam Hughes correspondence with the Premier, in which Sir Sam let the cat out of the bag regarding Sir Robert's plans in London. The Tories are chasing that cat yet, in fact the editorial referred to looks suspiciously

like an effort to convince the public that no such cat exists. Again, just yesterday, we had another instance of this much-vaunted Tory solidarity in the resignation of the Chief Conservative Whip. The only sign of unity in the Tory party which is mentioned by the News is the fact that there is an absence of conflict both in the house and in the cabinet. The fact of the matter is that Sam Hughes was the only member of the august body who dared to show any signs of scrapping, and even Sam only did so when he realized that it didn't matter a rap anyhow. Just imagine what would happen if any of the remaining members of the cabinet started anything that resembled a fight amongst themselves. Imagine Bob Rogers starting after some of the others and they in turn telling all they know about Bob. Whew! Wouldn't it be a corker? No, there will be no sign of conflict amongst the Tories at Ottawa. There will be absolute unity; the kind of unity there is between a drowning man and the oar which someone has thrown him.
