COALITION

That there is division in the government ranks over the question of coalition is evident from the editorials which are appearing in the Toronto News, dealing with coalition and also dwelling upon the solidarity of the Conservative party. In a recent article on "Coalition in Canada," the News says "Great Britain has been making political changes, going from coalition to coalition, in order to get rid of the very group among its statesmen that we in Canada are asked by coalition to reclothe with political authority." No mention has ever been made, except in the Tory press, of any attempt to bring about coalition in Canada, and it is very apparent that one wing of the Tory party is agitating for a coalition government in order that the responsibility for the grave war blunders may be shared, while another wing, the Rogers wing, is | strongly opposed to anything approaching coalition as there would be no profit arising from being members of a joint government.

The Toronto News. in the usual Tory fashion, tries to cast the blame for our unpreparedness upon the shoulders of the Liberals. Had Borden not been influenced by the Nationalists in killing the Laurier naval policy, Canada would have been better prepared than she found herself, and would not have needed to pay an exorbitant sum for two Chilean submarines which nobody on the coast could handle, the directions being all in Spanish.
