FORTY LIBERALS TO OTTAWA FROM WEST
 Winnipeg, Jan. 18.—There has been a series of conferences here of western Liberals this week to discuss the party's attitude during the coming session at Ottawa, and all indications point to the likelihood of a general election this summer.
 Hon. Frank Oliver, J. G. Turriff, W. E. Knowles, Dr. Neely, Hon. J. A. Calder, Senator Watson, Premier Norris, Attorney-general Hudson, Premier Brewster and 25 other prominent members and candidates were present.
 Opposition to Hon. Robert Rogers in South Winnipeg and Hon. Arthur Meighen, wherever he may decide to run, was planned. If necessary, Attorney-general Hudson will oppose Mr. Rogers. Manitoba has only two Liberal members out of ten seats, but after the next election there will be 16 members from the province. Sixteen Liberals will be sent from Saskatchewan and 10 from Alberta in place of six as at present. With 42 seats to fight for, the Liberals are confident 35 will be Liberal. With British Columbia's help, the western Liberals expect to send 40 members to Ottawa after the next election.

VITAL STATISTICS

There were three cases of German measles; one of chickenpox and one of scarlet fever. Every effort was made to trace the origin of the fever case but failed. There were no other cases.
