The keen interest which the Dominion Government is taking in Prince Rupert and the north is again exemplified in the report that the Cameron-Genoa Lumber Company is to be given a contract by the Federal Government for the building of two wooden schooners, with auxiliary power, to be built in Victoria. Nothing definite has yet been announced, but it is significant that this company is contracting for a year's output of the Port Clements sawmill on Graham Island, taking all the clear spruce which this mill can cut.

That our drydock, which the Vancouver Province recently denied the very existence of by stating that the nearest large floating drydock in British possessions was at Hong Kong, is able to handle big business, we know absolutely. That the north is able to furnish valuable lumber for many of the parts needed in wooden vessels we have ample proof of, yet the government ignores Prince Rupert and hands all the business to Victoria. It did not even think it worth while to split the business and give the north one ship to build.

Prince Rupert is represented in Ottawa by a member who has already signified his intention of devoting all his attention to the south, where he rightly belongs, and it is very evident that we are no longer represented in the Federal House. The attitude of Ottawa seems to be that it did not bring Prince Rupert into existence. and that it, therefore, has no business whatever to take the slightest interest in what is being done, or left undone, here. So far as the Borden Government is concerned, this city might be a fishing town on the coast of Alaska; a place where it is understood that halibut is landed in considerable quantities.
