place upon these declarations. In blunt language, that interpretation is nothing more nor less than that the new government must retain in office in toto, the entire staff left to it by the old regime. The matter need only be stated in plain terms to illustrate its own absurdity.

"Under my responsibility as a minister of the crown, I intend to recommend and to carry out only such changes as may be deemed to be in the public interest, but, from the performance of my duty in this regard, however unpleasant it may be, I am not to be deterred, either by interested or well-meaning criticism.

"The task ahead of us is an exceedingly heavy one, and will require united effort, but we must meet it with unflinching courage in order that the conduct of government may be placed upon a proper basis and the great resources of this province brought into production at the earliest possible, date."
