

#### DORCHESTER

According to the Tory inspired reports from Ottawa regarding the Dorchester byelection, the fact that Hon. Albert Sevigny, Minister of Inland Revenue, has been returned by a majority of 250 is ample assurance that the Opposition will not dare to refuse another extension of the life of the present Parliament. The. Tory assumption is that, because a small constituency in the province of Quebec has reelected the gentleman who, in 1911, asked, "What has England ever done for us?" that the whole of the Dominion is perfectly satisfied that the Borden government should still be permitted to carry on Canada's part of the war in its own sweet way, no man during to say them nay.

The Tory assumption is that, because Dorchester has endorsed Sevigny, the people of Canada are perfectly satisfied that the government which is sending hundreds of useless senior officers to England, to be scrapped along with millions of dollars worth of useless Canadian equipment, should be allowed to continue on its reckless course without a murmur; that the government which armed our soldiers with ineffective rifles for a year after they had proven ineffective should still have the directing of the lines of some hundreds of thousands of brave Canadian soldiers; that the government which allows the profiteers to get away with their millions, coined out of the suffering and misery of the people of Canada, should still hold sway; that the government which shelved the hospitals report of Dr. Bruce, because it did not consist of white-wash and flattery for the Tory leaders, is the kind of government the people of Canada desire above all things; that the Premier who was weak enough to tolerate Sir Sam Hnughes' STOP THIS LEAK blunderings for two years, and then shunt him because he bluntly told what he thought about the Premier, is the right kind of a leader for the Do-

minion in this great crisis, and that the Premier who has tolerated Hon. Robert Rogers in his cabinet, after the Winnipeg revelations, is the kind of man the people want to conduct to conduct their affairs.

It is excusable that the Tories; shound show signs of vast relief in the fact that Mr. Sevigny, one of the Nationalists with whom Sir Robert Borden burdened himself in 1911, has been re-elected, but it is ridiculous that they should, in their satisfaction at having supposedly postponed the day of disaster, assume that the rest of Canada is at one with Dorchester, Quebec, or that the rest of Canada heartily supports the bluntly expressed beliefs of the Nationalists.

Sevigny's re-election is hail-

ed as a victory for the Conservatives. Does the Tory press recognize Monk, Bourassa and the rest of that ilk as Conservatives? Dorchester was a victory for Bourassa. Monk and the rest of the Nationalists, who are avowedly anti-British. It is a victory for the men who, in 1911, declared that they would "Shoot holes in the Union Jack," and who described the Laurier cabinet as a "cabinet of Imperialists, disposed to sacrifice the interests of Canada. and to launch us into wars which do not concern us." It is a victory for the men who condemned Sir Wilfrid Laurier for his loyalty to the Empire. and, today, the party which seeks to show that Laurier is disloyal to the Empire, hails it as a gain for them. .. othing could be more eloquent of the dire straits in which the Tories find themselves. The Tories have again taken to themselves a serpent and are trying to convince themselves it is a dove. The awakening is not far distant and it will be a rude awakening.




