

Sir Thomas White's statement that "Anglo-Saxon freedom and Prussian militarism cannot both survive" is about the best possible reply to President Wilson's speech. As the Minister of Finance in the Canadian government pointed out, this is a war of "irreconcilable ideals" and this vital point is just what President Wilson has sought to ignore, or at least has gently evaded. In his efforts to maintain a strict neutrality, the President has endeavored to place the Central Powe and the Entente Allies upon the same plane.
