## LAST GASP

That Germany is at the last gasp is clear. In one last great outburst of titanic rage in having failed in her attempt to gain control of the whole civilized world, she has run amuck. The intimation from Berlin that Germany will immediately inaugurate a ruthless and unrestricted submarine campaign even to the sinking of hospital ships, possibly throws light upon the Wilson peace note and particularly upon the explanation of it by Secretary Lansing. It was hinted that the German note to Washington contained a threat against the United States if a campaign for peace were not started, but it is evident that, if there was a threat, it was a threat against humanity at large, and this is probably what Mr. Lansing meant when he said that it was becoming increasingly difficult for the United States to remain neutral.

President Wilson has been severely criticised, not only for his lack of action at the outbreak of war, but for his efforts to bring about peace while Prussian militarism remained in full sway in Germany. On the latter point, there has been room for criticism, and it would appear that the President has never fully realized just exactly what the Entente Allies have been fighting for. In his efforts to remain strictly neutral, he tried to convince himself that the belligerents were simply fighting amongst themselves for supremacy on land and sea and that the whole terrible turmoil was the outcome of the keeping up of huge armies and navies. Today, he must realize, if he never did so before, that Britain and her Allies are trying to throttle the mad dog of Europe. He must realize that there is just as great danger to the United States as there was to poor little Belgium, and that this is America's war because it is humanity's struggle to keep civilization upon the plane which it took centuries to reach.

President Wilson is undoubtedly a man of fine sus-

ceptibilities and that his peace effort was made in order to try and prevent the most terrible orgy of wholesale murder that the world has ever seen, a likely explanation. If so, he must be given credit for the possession of a kind heart, but poor judgment. In any case, one cannot believe that his effort was made solely to prevent the United States from being embroiled in the war, but in order to prevent murder.

That Sir John Jellicoe foresaw the period when all rules of warfare would be suspended by Germany and the fight would reach the biting and kicking stage, is certain. His blockade of Heligoland Bight was the first move, while the Admiralty has been working day and night producing small fast cruisers for the combating of the coming submarine campaign. So far as Britain is concerned, Germany cannot well do more damage than she has already done. She long since, in practice, suspended all rules and sunk everything in sight, the only difference now being that she has made an open declaration in the matter.

It seems certain that the United States is now in the war and that, at the time of writing, war has already been declared. There will be huge turmoil in the republic to the south, where there is a large German population, but the American born will be certain to prove that they are Americans first and, within a few months, there should be a million men under arms and the last stage of the war will have begun. Prussianism has made its last frantic kick; its death-throes will be terrible, but the monster will very shortly be no more.
