## A TRUE STORY

Under the above caption, the Fernie Free Press reproduces an editorial from The Week, an alleged independent weekly published in Victoria, from which the following is an extract:

"The indignation aroused in the ranks of both political parties by the unjust dismissal of the late Deputy Minister of Lands has placed the Minister on his defence, and forced him to offer some explanation. It is a pity that before doing so he did not consult his constituents of Prince Rupert, because they would undoubtedly have warned him against publishing such an improbable story as that which he gave to the press, especially when they themselves were in possession of the facts and the latter were bound to leak out. Those facts are, that prior to the general election the one man in Prince Rupert in line for the Liberal nomination was Mr. G. R. Naden. He was easily the most popular man locally in the party, and his past services to Liberalism, as well as the great strength he had developed practically ensured his receiving the nomination. Then there was Mr. Pattullo, an aspiring young lawyer, whose friends realized that there would be a portfolio going for the northern districts, and as it would probably be the portfolio of lands, it would be almost bound to go to a lawyer. Prince Rupert also was ambitious and wanted a portfolio. So a bargain was struck; Mr. Naden and his friends agreed to stand back, allow Mr. Pattullo to get the nomination, and do their best to secure his election with the proviso that if he succeeded Mr. Naden was to get the position of Deputy Minister of Lands. No further explanation is necessary, and under the circumstances it is little short of contemptible to suggest, as the Minister does, that it was necessary to get rid of Mr. Renwick, in order to clean up the department."

The first essential of a "true" story is that it be true, and we may safely leave it to members of both political parties

in this city and district to sift out the truth contained in this yarn. It will be harder work than looking for a needle in a haystack. Where the editor of The Week got his information is hard to say, but the story has the appearance of having been rigged up for the occasion. It will be news to Mr. Naden that he ever had any idea of running as a candidate here, or elsewhere, while so far was that gentleman from making any arrangement regarding the post as deputy that the minister of lands had a hard job to persuade him to accept the post when it was offered to him.

The most amusing part of the story is that which describes Hon. T. D. Pattullo as an "aspiring young lawyer." It is too bad that "T. D." has been keeping this information up his sleeve for so many years. The "lawyer" statement gives a true measure of the truth of the story, and it is to be hoped that the editor is a little more careful about the truth of his news items than he is about the truth of his "true" stories.
