A NAVAL SECRET

From a private source comes word that the undersea freighter Deutschland has been captured and is ignominiously chained up in Plymouth harbor. The tale is not likely to receive official confirmation. Nothing official was ever given out concerning the fate of her sister ship, the Bremen. The Bremen left Hamburg last summer. She never made any American port. But perhaps the Deutschland knows now where the Bremen went. We at least know that neither of them reached home. Germany's silence makes that certain.

The present significance of both incidents is very great. If these two boats, sent out with no mission but to elude the British fleet, and with all the ocean to hide in, have been taken, it makes the chances of ability in that respect.
