**WILL HOLD INQUIRY
INTO JOHN STANDING**

The Department of Marine and
Fisheries has instructed Captain
Charles Eddie, examiner of mas-
ters and mates, to conduct an in-
vestigation into the standing of
the Grand Trunk Pacific steamer
Prince John, Capt. Davies, which
went ashore at Rocky Point,
Wrangell Narrows, on January 26.
It is announced that the court
will convene in Vancouver next
Wednesday.

After hitting the rocks, the
rocks, the Prince John was
beached at Finger Point, and
later shifted to the wharf at
Tonka Cannery. Finally the ves-
sel was taken to Petersburg for
the purpose of landing her pas-
sengers, and then the B. C. Sal-
vage steamer Salvor arrived on
the scene from Victoria, tempo-
rary repairs were made by divers
and she proceeded south under
her own steam, conveyed by the
Salvor. She arrived in Vancou-
ver on February 4 and was taken
to the Wallace shipyards, North
Vancouver, for repairs. The G.
T. P. took advantage of the op-
portunity which offered, while the
vessel was laid up, to carry out
extensive alterations, which in-
clude another hatch to provide an
extra cargo space of 350 tons, and
considerable changes in the men's
quarters.
