FOR BABY

You cannot be too careful about the milk supply for a baby who gets his nourishment from a feeding bottle. There is not much trouble keeping a pitcher of milk sweet in winter, but the bottle needs special attention winter and summer. There should be two bottles, in order that there may always be one in germ-free condition. Do not let milk remain over in the bottle from one feeding to another, in however cool a place it might be kept. It is easy enough to measure out the correct amount for one feeding, and put that quantity in the bottle. As soon as baby is through with it, empty out whatever is left, and if it is convenient not to cleanse the bottle thoroughly just then, rinse it in cold water, and let it lie in water to which a pinch of bicarbonate of soda is added. Afterwards wash it with hot water and soap, and scald with boiling water. Important as it is to cleanse the bottle, it is even more so to make the rubber nipple scrupulously clean. Let it soak for a moment in the weak soda solution, cleanse with tepid water, then put it through the scalding water, or pour a steam of boiling water through it.

ITEMS OF SPORT

Alf. Shrubbs has sailed for England where he will take part in several long-distance events.

Albert Palzer, ex-amateur heavyweight of New York, has signed for a bout with Carl Morris at Tulsa, Okla., July 4.

Ad. Wolgast the holder of the 133-pound class is billed to meet Burns on May 27 and Moran on July 4, at San Francisco, both fights being scheduled for twenty rounds.

After a short rest at his home in Indianapolis, Ray Bronson says he will be ready to mingle with any of the lightweights looking for work.

As far as can be seen at the present time the hitting responsibility of Victoria's team rests upon five men, Davis, Million, Raymur, Householder and Goodman.

Billy Fitzgerald, the fast fielder of the Torontos, has signed a contract calling for a big salary, to play with Con Jones' team this summer. The general impression now prevails Jones will have no difficulty beating New Westminster for the Minto Cup.

"Parson" Davies and John R. Rogers have sailed for Europe in quest of the "white man's hope." Davies was former manager of John L. Sullivan and other pugilists. Rogers said he was going to talk things over with Hugh McIntosh in Paris and find some way to beat Jack Johnson.

Terry Turner is the regular third baseman of the Cleveland American team. Just at present he is not playing, owing to an accident which will keep him out of the game for a few days. Up to this season Terry has been the regular shortstop of the team, but he was switched over to third base when Bradley was sent to Toronto, of the Eastern League. Terry headed the league of short-stops last season with a fielding average of .973. He took part in 94 games, but finished the season with a batting average below .250.

James J. Jeffries announces through a "friend" that he was forced to enter the ring at Reno last July hungry and ill nourished through the treachery of those he trusted in the mining camp. According to an old-time racing man who has known Jeffries intimately for years, but who declined to have his name used, Jeffries will go to Baden-Baden shortly for the sole purpose of priming himself for a second go with Johnson.

Jack Johnson, negro champion, has returned from his two months' trip, and the first thing he did was to enter into a tentative agreement to box "Confessor Jack" O'Brien before the latter's club in Quakerburg. No date has been set, but it will be during the first week in June. O'Brien guarantees Johnson a lump sum of \$10,000 for his end. Johnson plans to grace the coronation ceremonies of King George V. in June. After this he will lend eclat to the Dublin horse show, and then he will go to Paris for diversion.

SPRING DAINTY

Try Rhubarb Leaves When Greens are Scarce

When green vegetables are scarce rhubarb leaves come in useful. Wash them well, take out the middle spine, and put them into boiling water, with a pinch of carbonate of soda. Boil till tender, then squeeze out all the water you can, and stir in a small piece of butter. You will think it is spinach you are eating. Nettles boiled in the same way, and eaten with white sauce, make a very pleasant vegetable.
