## AIR POSTAL SERVICE. LONDON AND PARIS

"Britain has been for some time considering the opening of an aerial mail route between London and Paris, which distance, about 138 miles, has been covered in one hour and forty minutes by a flying machine," says Captain Hugo Sundstedt, Sweden's long distance aviator, who has arrived in New York.

"According to the present route, says the Captain, the mail must first go by mail to Dover, thence by boat to Calais, and then by rail to Paris. Imagine the time this takes against a trip via aeroplane that can cover the distance in less than two hours."
