field rifles in Canada has been under consideration by the government for some time. Last September the matter was first broached to the British authorities.

The government has now a free hand to go ahead and manufacture a national arm without any profits going into private pockets. Following is a statement by Sir Charles Ross, giving the reasons for the closing:

"The management of the Ross Rifle Company regret to announce that they have closed down their factory for an indefinite period, owing to the cancellation of all existing orders for rifles by the Imperial and Canadian governments.

"The Imperial cancellation reached us a few days ago, and is to take effect on the 31st instant. The cancellation by the Canadian authorities was received only this morning, to take effect immediately, and this without previous warning or representation of any kind.

"In view of this, we were with regret forced to close our doors, although we were capable and willing to continue operations.

LAND REGISTRY ACT

(Sections 36 and 134.)

Re Application No. 91,111, Filing 5,814. TAKE NOTICE that application has been made to register John Bergman, of Prince Rupert, B.
