## MINISTER OF LANDS TELLS OF DRYDOCK

could be constructed, standing practically idle for two years. If the people of Vancouver or Victoria were so affected, would such a work to be allowed to lie idle? Hitherto, the voice from Northern British Columbia was as one "crying from the wilderness" and being so far away was perhaps not heard. He charged that eastern contractors were making huge profits out of the money which the government, or in other words the people, borrowed for war purposes. Later on the contractors' profits would be loaned out to the people for development purposes and thus the public would be paying interest twice on the same monies. "The remedy is that we should take a larger share of these profits. I claim that no man in these times has any right to make one dollar of abnormal profit."

### Too Much Legislation.

"There are many people who lay undue stress on legislation and not enough on administration. You can have the most perfect legislation on your statute books, but if it is not properly and wisely and prudently administered, you may have poor government," said the minister of lands. "Hundreds of thousands of acres of land have been alienated as agricultural land that should have been retained by the crown for lease as timber land and I can safely say that millions of dollars have been thus lost to the province. The time has come when there shall be no more acquiescence of the public domain by fraud or misrepresentation, or careless and slipshod methods of administration."

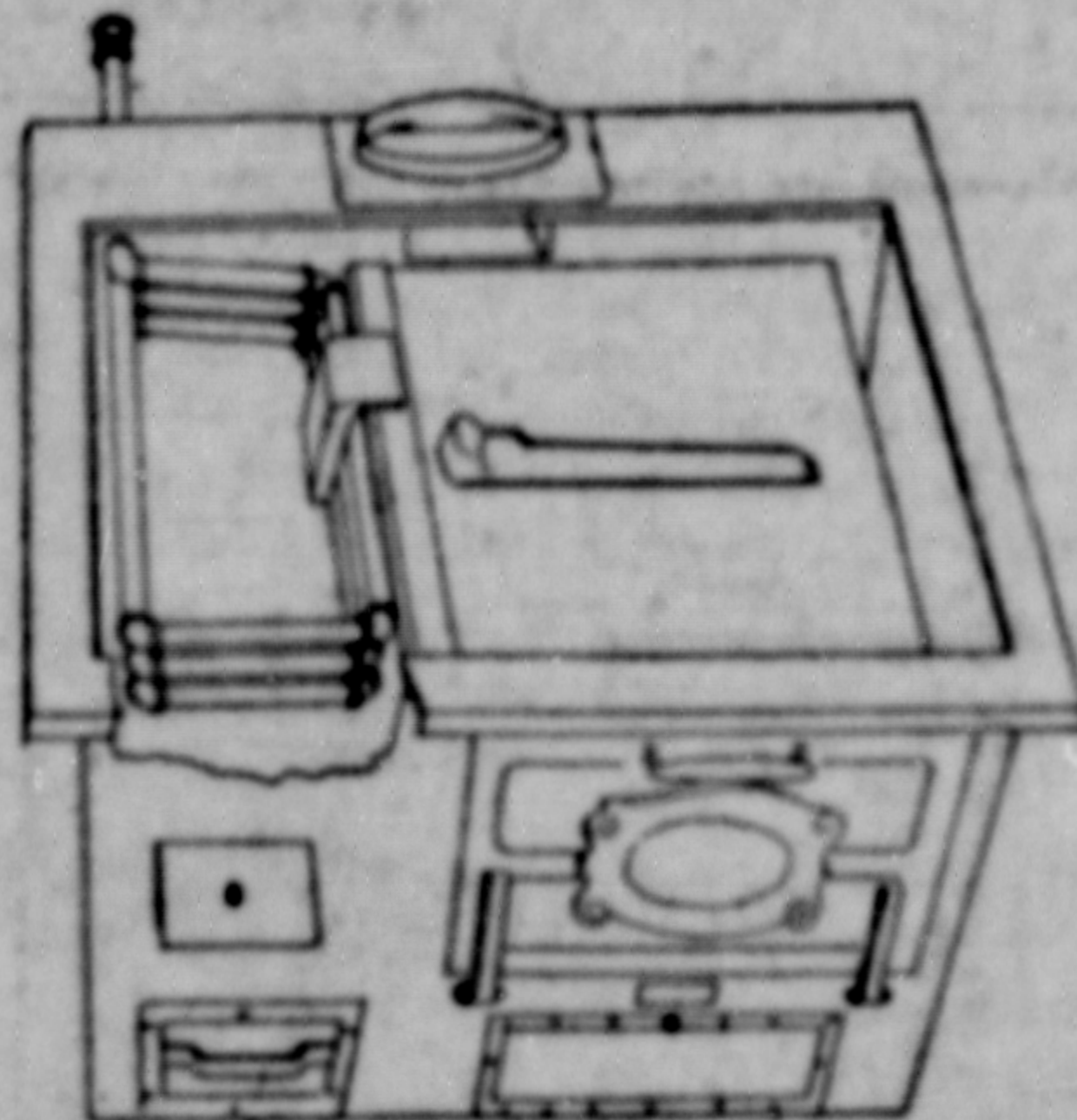
