WAR AND THE U. S.

At a public meeting held in New York last week it was stated that Germany and the United States were then at war. This statement was made by a former president of the United States, a former secretary of state, a former ambassador to Great Britain, and a retired judge of the United States Supreme Court. They were Messrs. Roosevelt, Choate, Root and Hughes. These men are not firebrands, but responsible citizens, who have held high office in their country and who have some considerable knowledge of the laws of nations. Germany has committed warlike acts against their erstwhile friends and there can hardly be any doubt that Germany is at war with the United States, but, as yet, the United States is not at war with Germany. It is a very one-sided arrangement. But that it will be changed in the very immediate future is evident from the arrangements being made before the meeting of Congress next week. The National Guardsmen have been taken under the control of the federal authorities in sixteen states already and mobilization has been ordered for others. This will make quite an addition to the armed forces of the republic and is only the beginning.
