GERMAN PROPOSAL DECLINED BY THE U.S.

Washington, March 26 .- The United States has formally refused Germany's request to modernize and extend the old Prussian-American treaties of 1799 and 1828. The State Department has replied through Dr. Paul Ritter, Swiss Minister here, in charge of German interests, refusing to accept the protocol sent through him to this government on February 10



Washington, Mar. 29 .- Twenty complete additional regiments and additional separate battalions of the National Guard troops have beeen ordered into the Federal service for the protection of property in the event of possible internal disorders. The troops have been called out in eighteen western and middle western states, not included in the list of orders made public yesterday. About twelve regiments of National Guard in various states were re-assembled to act as national police in important districts.
