HAZELTON DISTRICT MINING NOTES

News from the Babine Bonanza mine last week reported the raise from the No. 1 tunnel to be up 35 feet and had 50 feet to go to reach the floor of tunnel B. This raise has been driven for the purpose of opening the ore shoot which lies between the No. 1—the lowest tunnel—and tunnel B, and also for ventilation.

The raise is taking out a section of the vein seven feet long by five feet wide and producing good concentrating ore, and from which shipping ore may be sorted. The width of the vein will be determined later by cross-cuts. There is also some work being done on other ore shoots preparatory to stopping.

It is reported that Mr. Cronin is preparing for the shipment of a large tonnage of ore next winter, providing the government completes the wagon road which was partly built last year between Telkwa and the mine. It is understood that he has been getting quotations on ore sacks in car lots.

Since starting operations last April a thousand feet of underground work has been done at the Cassiar Copper Crown property on Grouse mountain. This work consists of a cross-cut tunnel 800 feet which encountered the vein at a depth of 250 feet. A drift was run in a northerly direction 106 feet where a new fissure vein was found running easterly and westerly. Now a drift is being run both ways on this vein and opening up the ore on both sides. This is the most interesting point in the whole works, being just between the two mineral bodies shown by the shaft and open cuts on the surface immediately above.

Mr. Trimble informed the Herald that he proposed sinking another shaft and pushing ahead the drifts. Mr. Pohlman, of Portland, and Mr. Kennedy, of New York, recently visited the mine.

The operators of the Santa Maria mine had a close race with nature to get all their supplies to the camp before the snow went. The last load went up Tuesday. The mine is now equipped with everything for five months.

HALIBUT ARRIVALS

The "Tide" has arrived with 3,000 pounds of halibut, the Deep C with 9,000 and the Guildford with 15,000 pounds. These are all Canadian boats. The Caruthers also came in with 75,000 pounds of all sorts of fish as the result of her trawling trip.

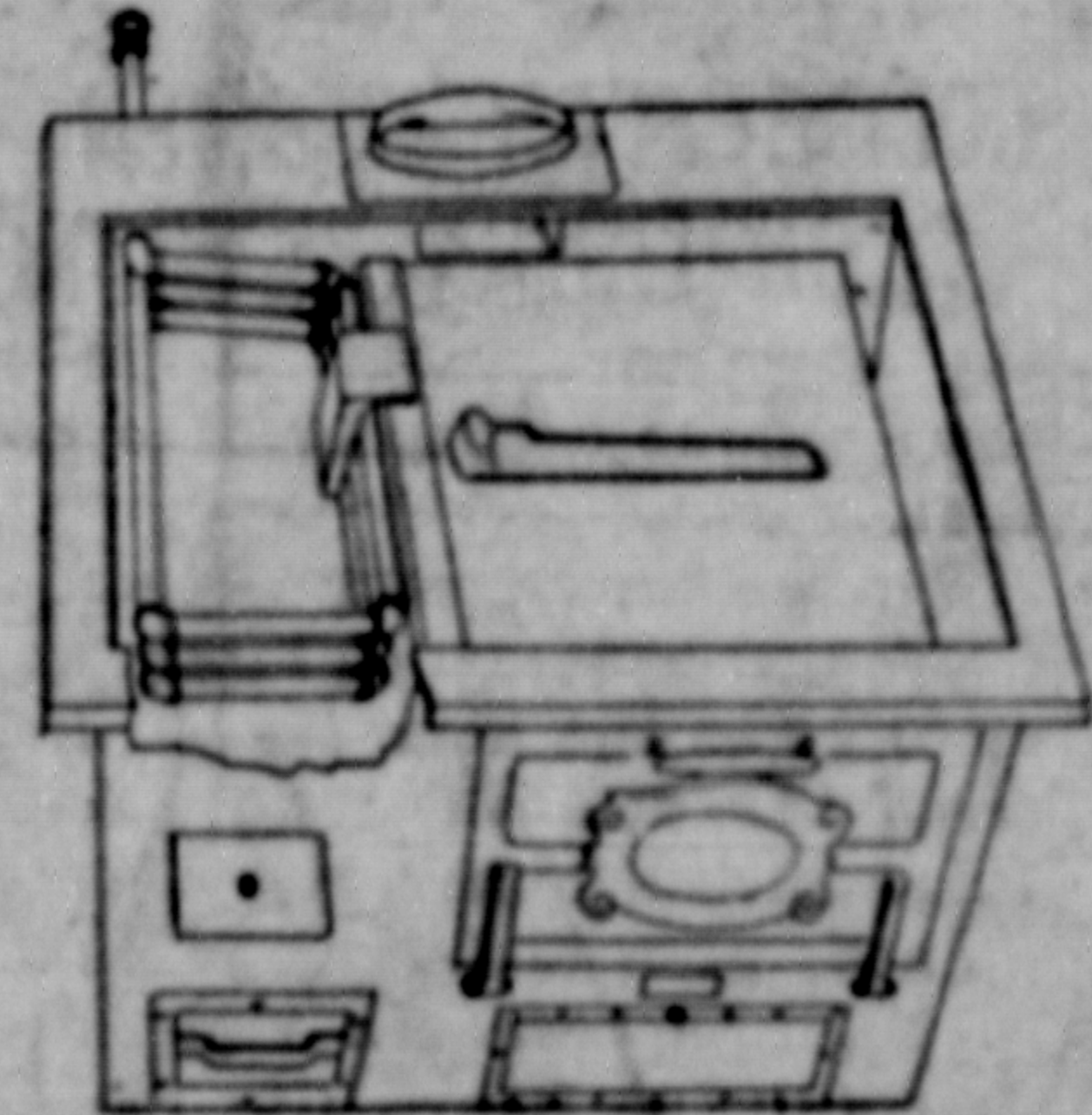
