not so much swank. We know all about it too."
Heroes! Well, soldiers don't use the word except with humorous chuckles. But if you like an old-fashioned word and want some heroes—the men would say stout fellows—you will find them already—and its pretty soon—in the Second Line out here.

Many have gained rewards for valor in the Second Line battalions, and many have gained no rewards but did well. They are old and familiar stories. I have been writing them about our men for nearly two years. The new men are like the old, and their courage is the same. Give them good leadership, and they will fight as those who fell at Le Cateau and checked the bull rush of the enemy's pursuit.

I met a crowd of these men the other night in a queer spot at the cross roads in a wild upland deep in snow with a blizzard blowing. They had built a big wooden hut there and fixed up a stage, and something like 600 men who had come tramping through the snow at as close as salted herring when the curtain went up for a performance of pierrots, who were their comrades in the trenches. The pierrots were all private soldiers of the Second Line except an officer who led them (he played Shakespeare parts in Benson's company before he put on khaki), but they had great talent in wit and humor, and the shed shook with laughter and then was very quiet when a fine tenor sang "To Anthea" and four good voices sang old glees. The D.A.D.O.S. had his usual share of chaff (he sat in front of me and chuckled at it). A grand piano had been brought from Paris after enormous difficulties in the way of transport, and the shed was a masterpiece of carpentry, and the engine which worked the lights was a very fine engine, though it froze during the performance. . . . And all this work would be utterly destroyed, because in three days those Second Line regiments were moving away. (It often happens like that—). But it was good to see the crowd—to see that in all their make-up they are like the men who come out before and done great things and endured all things without a moan, and because their courage is known—go singing the song of the old soldier down the roads of France. The Second Line has the right to sing it now—

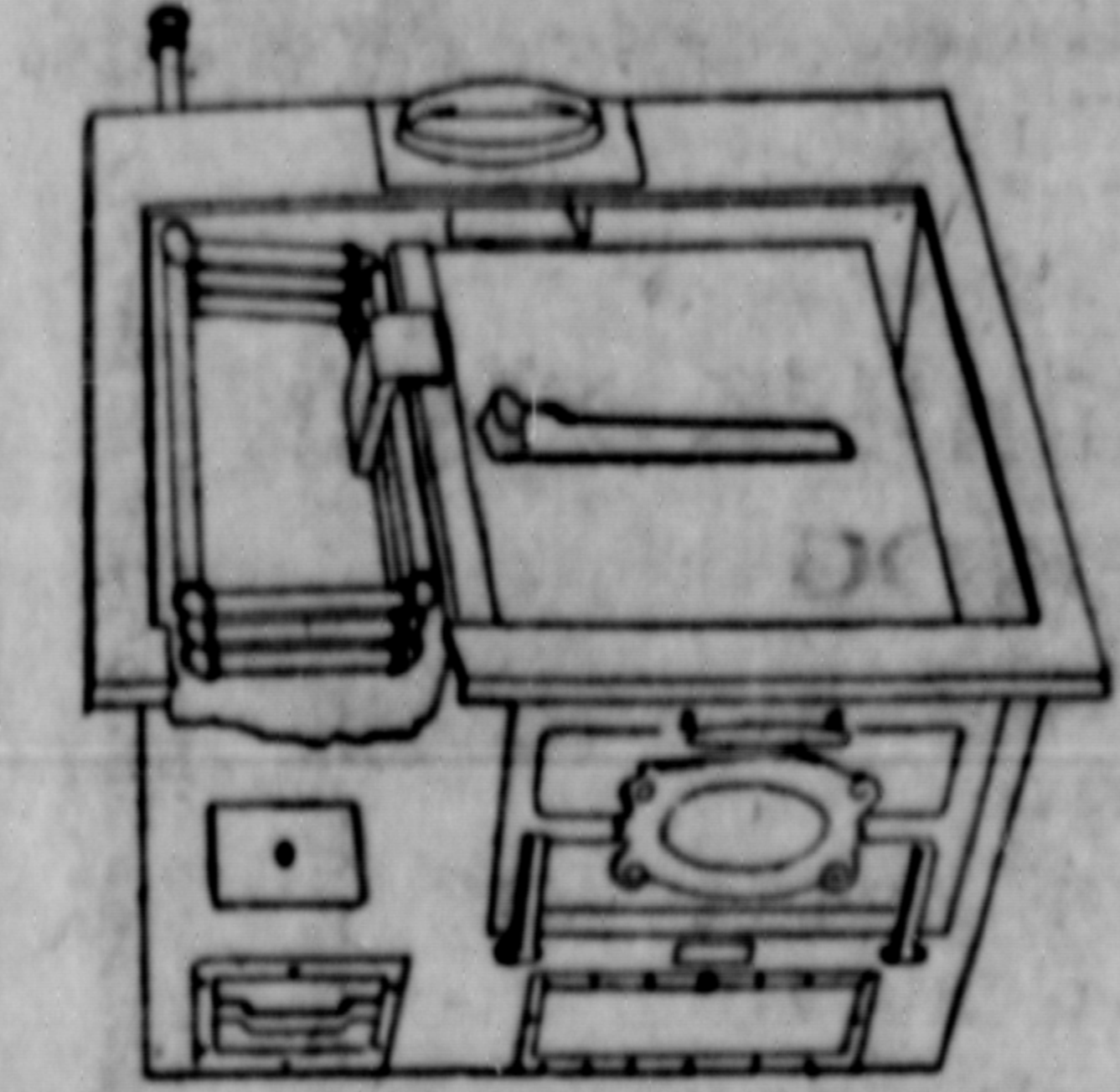
