UNCLE SAM'S PROBLEM

The problem of dealing with internal trouble in the event of war between the United States and German is giving the Washington Government no little concern. Some steps of a tentative character already have been taken. Two lists of Germans in the country to be dealt with have been prepared, one enumerating those who should be interned immediately and the other consisting of persons to be watched. Neither of these lists is complete and the facilities of the Secret Service are limited. On the other hand the German population is numerous and widely distributed.

The total number of Germans in the United States, estimated on the b asis of the census of 1910, is 8,282,618, of which 2,501,181 are foreign born. Of the latter New York has the lergest proportion, 436,874. Illinois is third with 233,384, with Pensynvania, Michigan and Minnesota following in the order named. Iowa has 98,758, Missouri, 88,-224, and California 76,305. The total includes more than 300,-000 reservists, many of whom may be storm centres, and every one of whom, therefore, would have to be interned immediately war developed between the two countries.

There are thus numerous elements of combustion in the neighboring republic, even if the majority of foreign-born Germans behave themselves. The problem would be complicated by the fact that German sympathizers in many quarters not improbably hold positions of trust which would enable them to facilitate conspiracies calculated to bamper the country in its prosecution of war. At the same time there is little doubt that German agents caught in acts of treachery would be swiftly punished. Where the processes of the courts were regarded as too dilatory the loyalists would take matters into their own hands and initiate the culprits into the simple ceremonies of the law as administered by Judge Lynch.
