HAZELTON MINING NOTES

The tunnel on the Hazelton View has been driven 487 feet, and has already disclosed several shoots of nice ore. One of these, 3 1/2 feet wide, gave an average assay of \$180, while another, three feet wide, returned \$90. Duke Harris, who is in charge of the work, states that some unusually high molybdenum values have been found in some places, while the average of this desirable mineral is over two per cent.

A syndicate of prominent Vancouver men, on whose behalf the American Boy property was recently examined, is considering the purchase of the unsold treasury stock, for the purpose of developing this well known group. Everyone in the district will wish their success.

There seems to be sufficient evidence on which to base a reasonable hope that the northern interior of British Columbia will in future years contribute materially to the copper production of the province. In regard to the Hazelton-Telkwa district proper, many of the ore bodies here should have attractive to small mining syndicates and individual operators, as large amounts of capital are not required to develop and equip these deposits of medium to high-grade ores. Capital is already coming in from Edmonton, Alberta, and Spokane, Washington, and the district appears to offer good opportunities for capital from Vancouver and Victoria.—Omineca Herald.

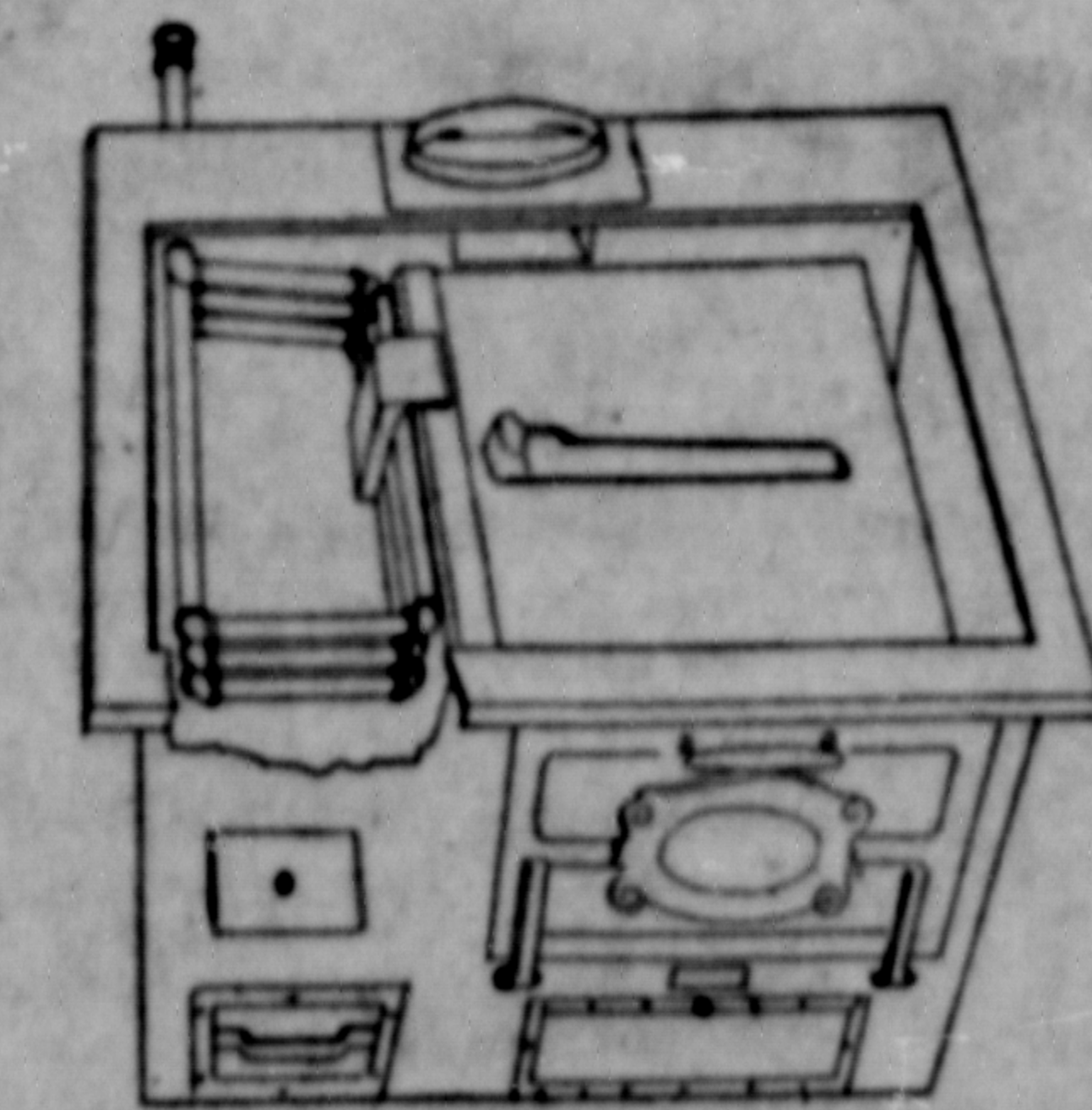
