### HE RETURNED SOLDIERS INTERVIEW THE COUNCIL

A delegation from the Returned Soldiers Association waited upon the city council last evening and the subject of the employment of 'alien enemies" by the civic government was discussed very fully. Mr. Peter Lorenzen, the city engineer, was the alleged alien enemy and his vindication by the city council was complete. In reply to the returned soldiers, the mayor and each councillor expressed their opinion of the case. For the returned soldiers it was stated that the matter had been brought to their attention by citizens outside of their association, and they admitted the right of the city council to act as they saw fit in the matter.

The facts as brought out in the council chamber were that Mr. Lorenzen was born of Danish parents in the lost provinces of Schleswig-Holstein, which were stolen from Denmark as were Alsace-Lorraine from France a few years later, by Germany. Mr. Lorenzen's father, although he continued to live in the conquered territory, was never else but a Danish subject, always refusing to take the oath of allegiance to Prussia. He educated his family likewise, to such good purpose that rather than swear fealty to their conquerors and serve in the German army, Mr. Peter Lorenzen left Schleswig before he became of military age. He came west, settled in Canada years ago and became a Canadian citizen.
