

How to go about it

BUY oggs for hatching or day-old chicks; borrow or buy a broody hen of an artificial brooder. elatted packing-box will house the bread crumbs soaked in milk and squeezed dry. Feed five times day, alternating with prepared chick feed, only as much as they will eat up clean. Remember that a hungry chick is a healthy chick.

CAUTION: Chicks must not fed until at least 48 hours old, and then only sparingly.

If you can, start now with eggs or chicks; if not, arrange at once with the local poultry association for pullets in the
