The bank of British North America at its annual general meeting in London on March 6th, reports of which have now reached Canada, presented a statement for the year ending November 30, 1916, which should afford complete satisfaction both to shareholders and clients of this solid institution, now more than eighty-one years old.

The chief item in the liquid assets is Canadian municipal and British Government securities, the latter of which includes \$4,501,666 of British treasury bills, against \$1,022,000 of that class of security a year ago. The increase in this item absorbs not only the whole of the new funds placed in the liquid reserve, but also a portion of the abnormally heavy cash items of last year.

Profits for the year amount to \$546,346. Out of this a dividend of 40 shillings per share has been declared, making the total distribution for the year at the rate of 7 per cent per annum. Substantial appropriations were made for the various funds for the benefit of the staff, and a general staff bonus of 5 per cent on the salaries were granted, extending to all members on active service.

Eighty-First Annual Report and Balance Sheet

Report of the Directors of The Bank of British North America, Presented to the Proprietors at Their Eighty-First Yearly General Meeting, on Tuesday, March 6th, 1917.

The Court of Directors submit the accompanying Balance Sheet to 30th November last. It will be seen that the profits for the Year, including \$52,175.71 brought forward from 30th November, 1915, amount to \$598,522.11 of which \$146,000 was appropriated to a dividend paid last October, leaving a balance of \$452,522.11, out of which the Directors propose to declare a Dividend of 40s. per Share, payable, less Income Tax, on 6th April, and a Bonus of 5 per cent. to the Staff, estimated to cost about \$34,100.00, leaving, after the other special appropriations mentioned in the Balance Sheet, an amount of \$104,222.15 to be carried forward.

The above Dividend will make a distribution of 7 per cent. for the Year. The Dividend Warrants will be remitted to the Proprietors on the 5th April. During the year ended 30th November last, the Sub-Branch at Ituna, Saskatchewan, was closed. The following appropriations from the Profit and Loss Account have been made for the benefit of the Staff, viz:—
