The legend of the Phoenix, the miraculous bird that is perpetually reborn from its own ashes, is associated by one group of scholers with Egypt, and by another with Arabia. Thanks to Great Britain, the political symbolism of the myth is now applicable to both these countries. In both cases, too, the consuming element that reduced to ashes a once glorious national life has been the same. In Egypt our struggle with the Turkish blight, complicated as the situation was by international agreements and by our own vital interests in the Canal route, was necessarily a long one; circumstances demanded that we should retain a very close control over the country, and the progress towards self-government will naturally be very slow and gradual. That, by the way, is in accordance with the long and slow-moving history of the most ancient of civilised nations. A simpler situation and a more rapidly changing picture are, with equal appropriateness, presented to us today by the region whose adventurous and high-spirited peoples passed, within the lifetime of Mohamet, from the stage of heathen tribalism to that of monotheistic nationalism, and from the age of song and legend to that of worldshaking history. History today is moving far more rapidly than in the days of Mahomet. The prophecies of ages are being fulfilled within a few months. Great events are following so close upon one another that it is difficult to grasp their enormous significance. and in the glare of the Russian Revolution many peoples may have failed to notice the impressive way in which General Maude's proclamation to the people of Bagdad connects itself with the extraordinary history of the Arabs.

There is only one people whose history rivals that of the Arabs in strangeness, and that is the Jewish people. And the Jews and the Arabs are essentially of the same blood; to the Arabs the Jews are "Beni-Israel," a tribe of their own race; the heroes of the Old Testament have a place in Arab legend and religion, and it was from the descendants of Jewish


