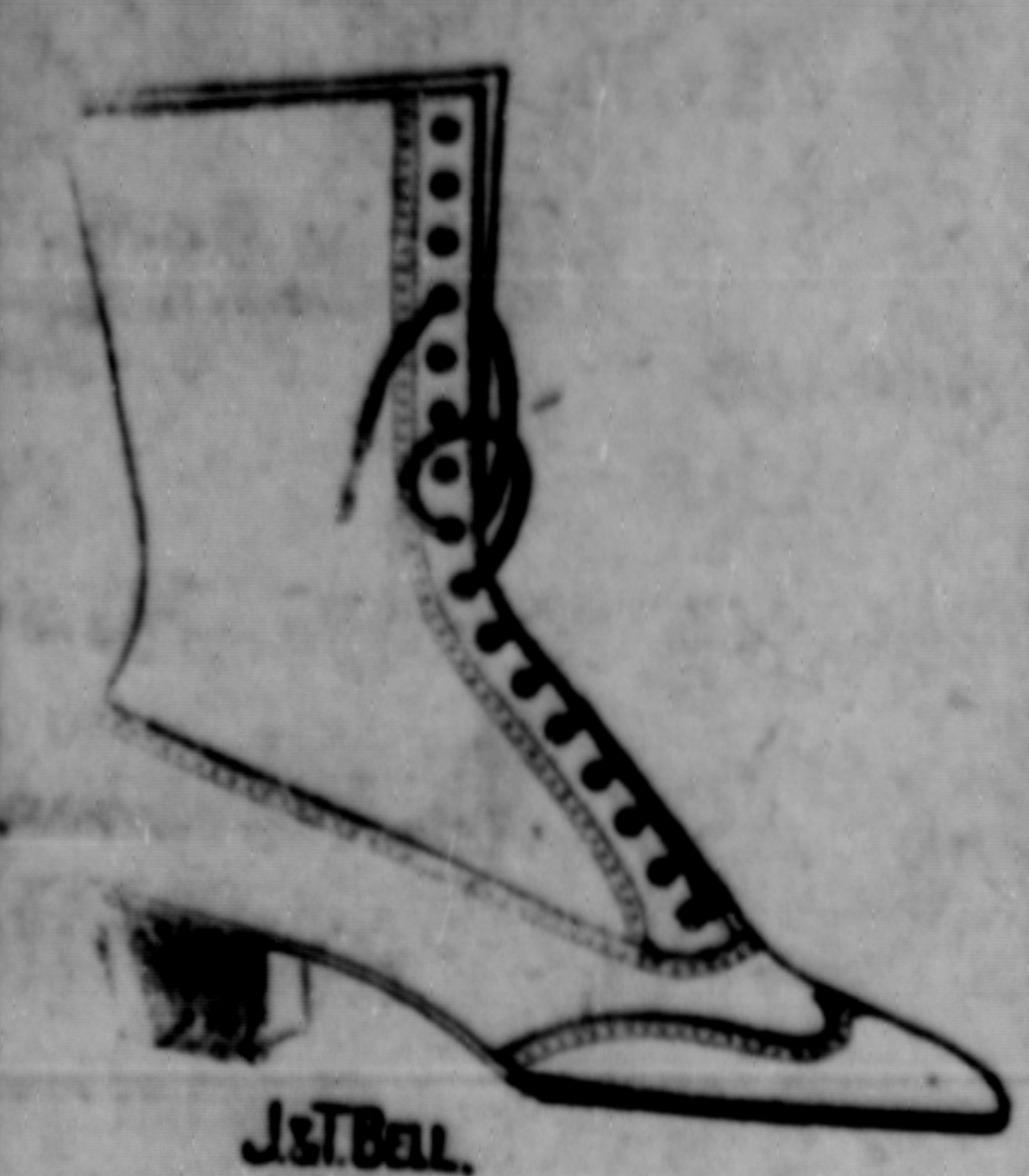

**"BOB" INGERSOLL ON THE GERMAN AMERICANS**

(Continued from Page Three)

backed by sufficient strength to enforce them. We shall have peace only when we can enforce it.

"Now as to so-called patriotism, I ask you to look at this picture: Over in Europe there is a little woman in a little home to whom has been born a man-child. But a short distance away, across an imaginary boundary, there is another little woman to whom has been born a man-child. As these boys grow up and begin to toddle around their mother's knees, the mother on this side takes her son in her arms with loving caress and says to him: 'Sonny, do you see that boy over there? Yes. That is a French boy, my son, and when you grow to be a man you must kill him.' Another time the little mother on the other side that imaginary boundary line, comes out into the sunshine and says to her loved offspring: 'My son, do you see that little rascal over yonder? Yes. That is a German boy, and when you grow to be a man you must kill him.'

"Those boys began to grow up and began to support their much-loved mothers. It was hard work and they barely subsisted. Then came the conscription. If they went to do their military duty for the love of their country, their loved ones might starve. So they escaped and came to this country. Here they prospered, sent for their mothers and the girls they loved best.

"Now, suppose war should sometime be declared between Germany and this country. The German boy is happily married here and raising a family. Does he leave all this to go back and fight for the country that gave him birth? Of course he does, you gentlemen say. Of course he does, say all; for that is the patriotism poets have dinned into our ears ever since the printing press was invented—and before that. Of course he goes to fight for the country where he couldn't get a living against the country that gave him a good living and glorious opportunity. For that is called patriotism, the most glorious thing for which a man can sacrifice his life and his all.

"Sure, that is a kind of patriotism. It is not the highest kind. It is what I call mere "mud patriotism." The patriot is the man who fights for his hearth and home and those he loves. If merely to fight for the land of one's birth were patriotism, where in history would most of those be who fought to found these United States? There is a higher patriotism than mere mud patriotism, and those Germans who have made this country their home will, like the English settlers who fought against King George in the ever-glorious Revolution, fight for their homes, and not for the mud on which they chanced to be born."
