

WASHINGTON CONFERENCE

In discussing the wider politics of the world, and the international war council meeting in Washington relative to the conduct of the war, the Sun thinks that this conference will have a significance larger than that of any previous gathering of the powers. It will have a portent for Germany darker than any shadow yet cast on that empire whose destiny is closing in upon it. This conference of high representatives of Britain and France with the American government in the capital of the United States might well be called the council of destiny for at that meeting the fate of Germany will be decided.

It has been announced that Foreign Secretary Balfour, a former premier of England, Mr. Viviani, one of the leading French statesmen, and formerly premier of France, and other high officials, including the governor of the Bank of England, will meet at Washington within a few weeks to form plans for the successful prosecution of the war. Other allied governments will be represented at the conference by their ambassadors.

For Germany this conference will have a most sinister aspect. It will remove the difficulties of co-operation between the United States and the allied governments. A mighty scheme for carrying the war to a triumphant end will be laid. It may be imagined that no question bearing on the war will be left unconsidered.

The conference will undoubtedly mark the beginning of the last stage of the war. Among other matters, the question of the peace terms to be eventually made, and the reconstruction which will follow. will be discussed.
