CONSCRIPTION

The bill for conscription by selective draft has passed through Congress by whelming majorities in both the Senate and the House of Representatives. As a result of this, the young men of the United States, between the ages of nineteen and twenty-five will be called upon immediately. As necessity demands, the age limit may be extended, when greater numbers of men are required.

Already in Great Britain, every man medically fit, up to the age of forty-five has been conscripted and is engaged in some military capacity. Now that Canada has got another lead, this time from her neighbor in the south, what will she do in this direction? It has been said that Canada, being chiefly an agricultural country, could not stand conscription of her manhood, as they were required for the equally necessary work of growing food for the Empire. But in the United States, a similar state of affairs exists. The Entente commission now at Washington! has informed President Wilson that the Governments of the European Allies expect the United States to supply them with foodstuffs, and have left the matter in their hands enirely. This is the greatest service that the United States can render as their share in the winning of the war. How they will set about doing this remains to be seen. -



RECORD WAGES FOR SAILORS

New York, April 28 .- What is said to be the topmost price ever paid for service was recorded today with the signing of a crew of an American ship that is to sail through the submarine zone.

The first mate will get \$300 a month, chief éngineer \$250, second mate \$200, first assistant engineer \$200, and so on down the line to firemen and coal passers at 860 to \$75, with mess boys at \$45. In addition a war bonus of 100 per cent is promised doubling the wages-which are to continue until the men are back at the port of embarkation. Should the ship meet disaster the men are to be transported home and the sum of \$250 for officers and \$100 for men will be paid to all who lose their personal effects.
