THE WOMEN'S PART

One of the most significant features of Mr. Lloyd George's speech at the Guildhall a few evenings ago, says the Victoria Times, was his statement that three million acres of fresh land was under cultivation in the United Kingdom.

A little study will reveal behind that bare announcement a remarkable chapter of achievement. The area of new land thus described is equivalent to almost one-third of the area under wheat in the three prairie provinces. It is equal to onequarter of the entire area under food crop in the kingdom when the war broke out.

In 1914 the extent of land under corn crop, that is, wheat, barley, oats, rye, beans and peas, was 8,216,000 acres. The area under green crops, comprising vegetables, was 4,056,-000 acres. There were 50,000 acres under flax, 37,000 under hops and 101,000 under fruit. Clover and mature grasses accounted for 6,605,000 and permanent pasture for 27,350,000 acres.




