

# How to go about it

BUY eggs for hatching or day-old chicks; borrow or buy a broody latted packing-box will house the queezed dry. Feed five times a day, alternating with prepared chick feed, only as much as they will eat up clean. Remember that a hungry chick is a healthy chick. CAUTION: Chicks must not be fed until at least 48 hours old, and hen only sparingly.

If you can, start now with eggs or chicks; if not, arrange at once with the local poultry association for pullets in the
