The Colonial Secretary's telegram was less an invitation than an urgent summons to the Prime Ministers of the dominions to attend "a special war conference of the Empire." They are to attend a series of special and continuous meetings of the War Cabinet in order to consider. (1) urgent questions affecting the prosecution of the war; (2) the possible conditions on which, in agreement with our allies, we could assent to its termination, and (3 the problems which will then immediately arise.
