## THE BORDEN CABINET AND AN ELECTION

long enough. But the consumer, poor wretch, gets no relief this side of the grave—no relief except dilatory commissions on the High Cost of Living and soft words from Mr. Crothers. England has regulated food prices; Australia has regulated food prices; all the belligerents near or remote have regulated food prices—all, that is to say, except Canada, which gave the Borden Government full authority to do so, but the Borden Government preferred not to act. Several times in the last three years deputations of the people have come to Ottawa crying for bread and always the Borden Government has offered them a stone—a soap stone per chance—a soft soap stone.

Rumor has it that the Borden Government may be reconstructed, after which, following some great war victory, it will go to the country with flags and loud acclaim. Reconstruction, as it were, to be followed by destruction. The only thing against this theory is that those who are picked out to quit, Dr. Roche, Mr. Burrell, the three Nationalist cabinet ministers, are not willing to be reconstructed. Mr. J. W. Flavelle, from whom all blessings flow, is mentioned as one of the strong men to be taken in. We would be pleased to hear how the bacon eaters of Canada regard any closer connection by Mr. Flavelle with public life than he has already. All those in favor of Mr. Flavelle, say "Aye." The noes seem to have it.

The corridor gossip is that an extension is the first thing Premier Borden will ask for when he gets back. It will be up to Parliament to decide whether the Borden Government wants an extension to do good or to do as it has been doing—spending a million dollars a day, a considerable part of it being flung to the birds. The Borden Government may take the ground that it can extend its life by using the majority which it now has in both houses. This would be a hard job at the constitution, but the Borden Government has a come-back for that too. They may put up the argument that what they do in a crisis to the British North America Act is their own affair, because the Imperial Parliament may not be sitting at the time when they need it, to ratify their amendments. They may put up this argument—and they may not. They would hardly have the nerve. However, it has been broached by their friends.

The good guessers believe that the Government will defer its request for an extension until the dying moments of the session. If their request is refused they will shiver on the brink all summer and go to the country in September. The present extension is good until October 1st. The session will probably last to the middle of June. This will give the Conservatives about three months to prepare for death. All too short a time, considering the sins it has on its head.—H. F. G.
