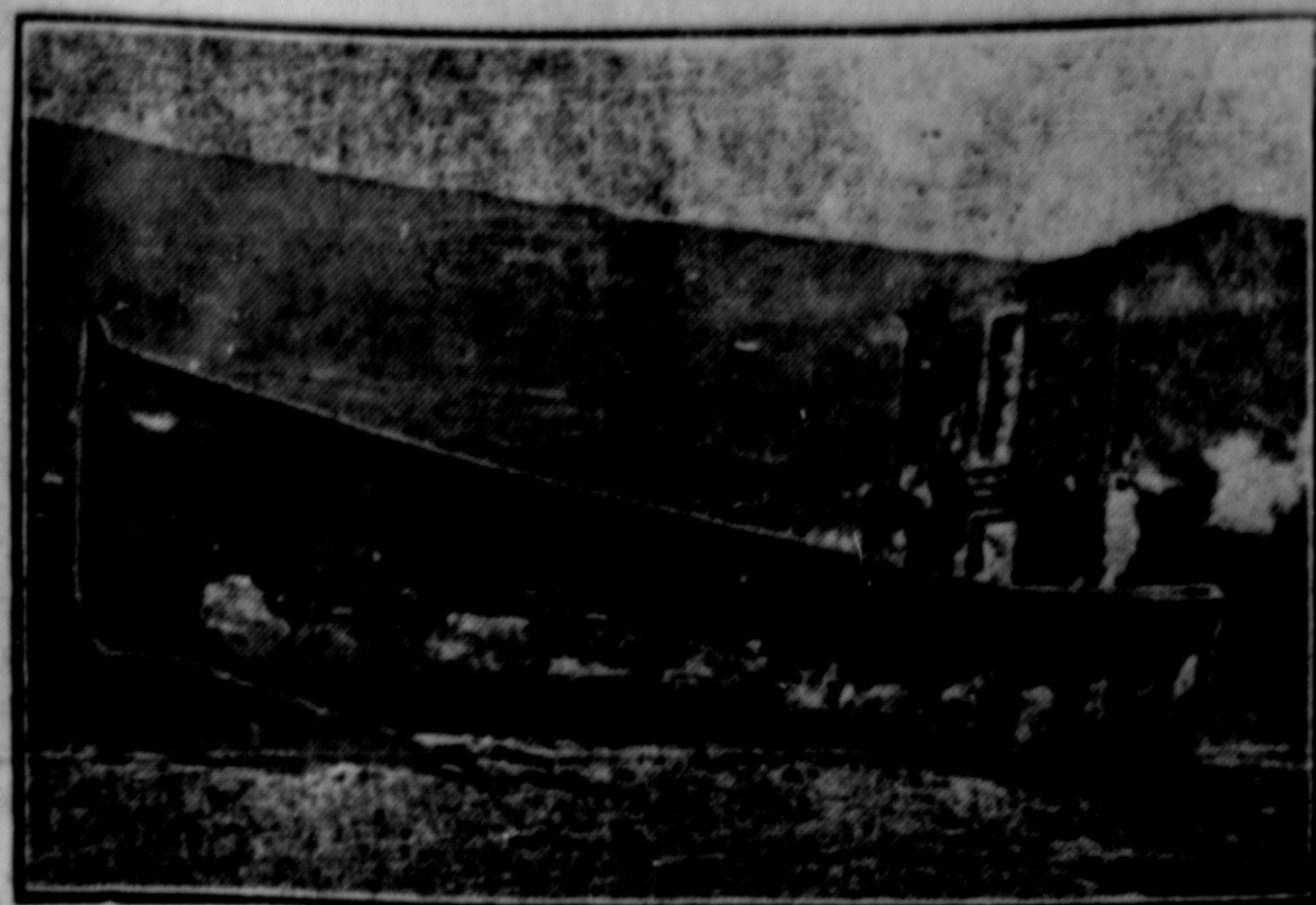

CONSCRIPTION OF NATIONAL WEALTH

At the Methodist Conference held at Victoria this week, the following was brought up in the report of the Social Service Committee:

"Whereas the international crisis has revealed the wastefulness and inadequacy of the prevailing system of competitive individual initiative and exploitation, together with the necessity of Canada sustaining until the last its contribution to a righteous world order, the Conference earnestly calls upon the National Government without delay to assume control of the total resources of the nation; to include the immediate enrollment and conscription of all men of military age for service in the army and otherwise; the redistribution of the remaining manhood of the country to meet the needs of the nation; and the complete national control of all natural and financial resources for the service of the nation to the exclusion of all abnormal private gain."

"The organization of the community on Christian principles for the exchange of service is hindered by the present organization of production for profits," says the report of the committee. "Consequently the quest for profits on necessary transaction has hampered the efficient exchange of services and commodities. We therefore call attention to the present high cost of living as including elements of profits on speculative and other wasteful processes, and we request that the Federal Government institute a searching inquiry which shall seek to make natural resources most economically accessible to all the people."

Until very recently, the ideas contained in this resolution were regarded as being beyond the bounds of possibility of being brought into action for many generations. Such thoughts were considered as the particular property of the Socialists and as dreams of the distant future. At the present moment, the necessity for action along these lines has increased and it has been proved in the belligerent countries that state ownership and management can be successfully accomplished, even in time of war.

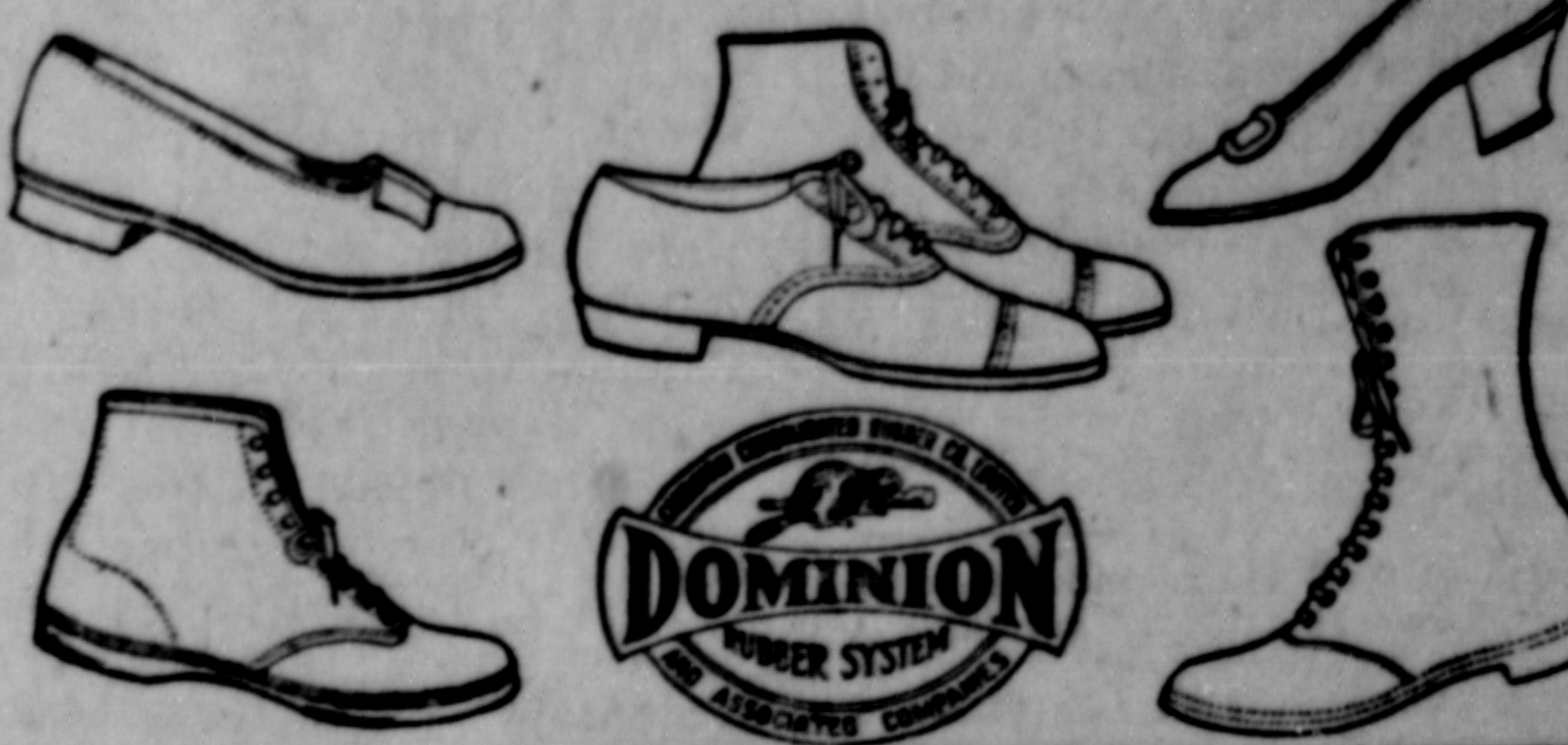
