ACT NOW!

In setting up a food control organization with Herbert Hoover at the head Washington has furnished the Canadian Government with another example which should be followed without further delay. Mr. Hoover proposes to divide the organization into four branches. One will consist of a number of separate executive bodies for the regulation and administration of certain critical commodities, whose duty will be to institute such measures as will stabilize prices and distribution. The second will ensure co-operation with the various states, which will be requested to organize subsidiary state food boards. The third will initiate a campaign for domestic economy, while the fourth will concern itself with co-operation with the Allies in regard to this vital question. "The powers being asked for," Mr. Hoover adds, "are considerable in order that we may force into the market every form of foodstuff over and above such stock as normally and legitimately belongs! to any particular business for its proper conduct and to prevent any withholding, directly or indirectly, of food supplies from the market."


