duced by Ald. Casey, who addressed the council on the labor situation. Being a practical shipbuilder, and thoroughly acquainted with the trade particularly on this coast. He claimed that there was no lack of labor, but that there were plenty of experienced shipyard men, and men whose homes were in Prince Rupert, who had been forced to go south to where their work was. It was futile to state that ships could not be built in Prince Rupert for the lack of men, because the men had to leave Prince Rupert for the lack of work. One instance was given on this point. Sixty men were required for the building of ships at Whitehorse, and no difficulty had been experienced in getting them up there.

#### WATER FOR INDUSTRIES

A report from the public utilities committee was brought in to the city council last night recommending that the report of the superintendent as to the piping of a water supply for the Emerson mill at Seal Cove be adopted. Ald. Montgomery was opposed to this work being done at the expense of the city, and could see no purpose in the recommendation of the superintendent. As several aldermen were not quite clear as to the provisions of the recommendation it was moved that the matter be deferred for a week. In the course of the discussion, Ald. Montgomery threatened to become obstreperous. "You're out of order, Alderman Montgomery," said the mayor sternly. "I object to the mayor speaking at all," retorted Ald. Montgomery. "You're out of order yourself. Leave the chair and put someone in your place, if you want to speak on the subject." But there the matter ended.
