## WHAT IS COMING ON THE BELGIAN COAST

London, June 6 .- Reports from both Berlin and London today indicate the probability that an important military movement by the Allies is under way on the Belgian front - possibly an attempt in force to hit the German flank on the coast a crushing blow.

A pitch of notable intensity such as usually precedes an attack has been reached by the artillery fire near the coast and to the south in the Ypres district.

Meanwhile British air raids have been carried out on and near this coast. Many tons of bombs. says the London official report, have been dropped on Ostend, 2 Bruges and Zeebrugge, the last named being one of the principat German submarine bases.
